

## 2007 MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- We had a very difficult time establishing the schedule for 2008. After a lot of discussion, we settled on two three-day events as an experiment.
- Organizing clubs will have an AMA agreement that they need to sign and return as part of a new AMA requirement.
- Behling re-elected as CEO, C. Saum re-elected as CFO, Bolander elected as COO.
- Both Laura and Howard Galbreath are “stepping down” to avoid further burn out. We are thankful for their many years of hard work and recognized them officially as “Friends of the NATC.”
- NATC Board actions included establishing new processes for team selection, support and management, including a new team manager (Kip Webb) and filling the role of AMA representation to the FIM at the TdN event with a Board appointed NATC person, (Ted Gansberger for 2008).
